Welcome

We are delighted to welcome you to Beth Meyer Synagogue to worship and celebrate with us as XXXXX is called to the Torah as a Bat Mitzvah. We feel blessed that our family and friends could be here to share this simha with us.

The Bat Mitzvah ceremony is a significant rite of passage in the life of a Jewish woman. For the Jewish people, it builds upon traditions that are thousands of years old. The term "Bat Mitzvah" literally means "Daughter of the Commandments." The Jewish people made a covenant with God at Mount Sinai. In exchange for receiving the Torah (the Five Books of Moses), Jewish people promised to teach the wisdom of the Torah to their children from one generation to another. XXXXX has shown she is ready to take on the responsibilities as a new member of the Jewish community. As we celebrate this milestone in XXXXX's life, we are very proud of her accomplishments and all the work she has done to prepare for this special day.

Torah Service: Taking the Torah scroll from the Ark is accompanied by singing and a procession around the synagogue. This allows all congregants to be close and touch the Torah. In addition, XXXXX's family and friends, and members of the congregation, will be honored with Aliyot (honors of being called up to the Torah). You may follow the Torah readings in Hebrew or English in the <u>H</u>umash (red-covered book) found at your seat.

XXXXX will be honored with the special Maftir Aliyah, and then will chant that part of this week's Torah portion. Elyssa will then chant the Haftorah, a selection from Prophetic Writings. This week is very unusual in that three Torah's are brought out at once, (most weeks only one is used). We have two extra events that cause this, Rosh Hodesh (the new month) and Shabbat Shekalim (a special Sabbath). It is very rare that all three occur on the same day, but we believe it makes this day even more special for XXXXX. The three Torah's are then placed back into the Ark as they were taken out, with singing and a procession around the synagogue for the second time.

Musaf Service: XXXXX will lead the Musaf (additional) Service and concluding prayers for the morning.

Kiddush: XXXXX will recite the *Kiddush* and *Motzi*, prayers for wine and bread before we enter the social hall for lunch in celebration of her Bat Mitzvah.


